## **TEAMWORK**

A "team" consists of two or more individuals engaged in an activity to reach a common goal. When we think of "teamwork" it is usually in the context of completing a task or a job together. Working together on the job has many benefits: distributing the work load, increasing productivity and reducing the risk of injury.

Studies have shown that the effectiveness of a team increases with the social familiarity of the team members. The more you know and like someone the more you are able to trust and count on him or her. You get to know one's skills, capabilities and weaknesses as others get to know yours. The key to working together effectively and efficiently is to offset the weaknesses with each other's strengths. One person may be able to reach higher or lift more; another may be more agile or faster with numbers. Whatever these differences may be, compatible individuals will invariably find ways to work together that are mutually beneficial.

The same is true in larger groups. A team that continues to work together will eventually develop an increased level of bonding and efficiency. This can help team members avoid unnecessary conflicts since they have become well acquainted with each other through teamwork.

When we work together in larger groups on more complex jobs, we can overcome problems by sharing ideas from each individual's unique set of experiences and knowledge. The more knowledge we share, the more we gain. As we work together to take on greater challenges, the more capable and productive we become.

Another positive benefit of teamwork is a healthy sense of competition among co-workers. This helps to keep everyone on his or her game, easing tensions and creating a sense of community. Teamwork goes a long way to moving through the day comfortably and enhancing the quality of working life.
